The month of January has certainly gone quickly. I hope you have managed to enjoy some time off and ready for another exciting year ahead in Cue. The youth program is up and running for 2023 with activities alternating between the town hall and the railway building. The Shire has put tenders out for asphalt correction works on Beringarra Road and also for the sealing of the aerodrome with works expected to start in the coming months. The Shire is currently advertising for a mechanic. Details of the position are available on Seek.

Australia Day 2023 celebrations were held Thursday 26 January with around 120 people in attendance. The children loved playing on the water slide, and everyone enjoyed food supplied by the Shire. We were entertained by Boink and then Geoff Udy carried on into the evening with people dancing and singing along. And, then came the spectacular fireworks conducted by WestCoast Fireworks. Everyone commented on what a wonderful night it was. A big thank you to all the staff who helped to bring the day together and to Auspire, part of the Australia Day Council National network, for providing grant funding for this event. I would like to also thank the Police, St John Ambulance and the Volunteer Fire and Rescue services for their support.

Residents are asked to check their properties and remove any potential mosquito breeding areas, by emptying containers holding water, ensuring gutters are not holding water and checking yards for areas that hold water.

Our Shire President Ross Pigdon joined by CEO Richard Towell presented the Australia Day recipients with their awards.

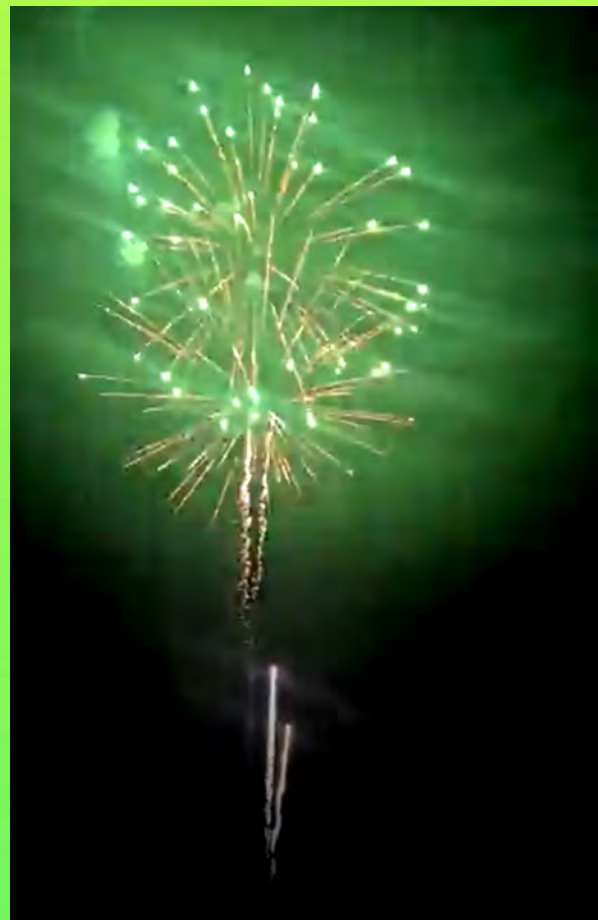



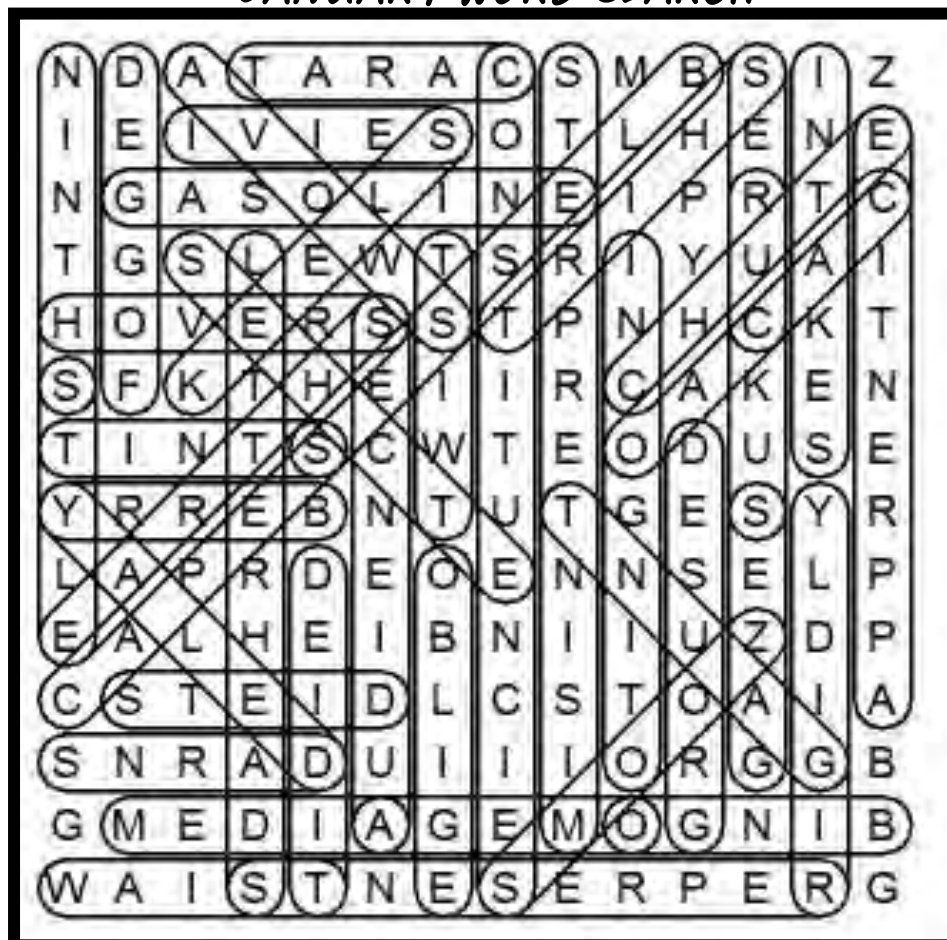
