CHC NEWS

Harry Verelis is a supporter of volunteer aid workers. Harry has revamped, repaired and restored ophthalmic equipment for Rotary, Doctors Without Borders, The Fred Hollows Foundation and mission hospitals for no charge over many decades. The equipment is used overseas to help restore or maintain the sight of poor people in undeveloped countries.

Along with other ophthalmic companies, Harry has worked to establish a process of collecting second-hand frames, and following their repair and grading in the Acacia Prison workshop, they are distributed to where they are needed. Collected spectacles are cleaned and graded while glasses beyond repair are dismantled for their recyclable components. Sunglasses can also be recycled which is helpful for some developing countries where sun-related eye damage is a growing problem.

Recently, on a visit to Harry in Perth, I asked where I could get some olden-day equipment for the Heritage Centre. He promptly supplied some ophthalmic eye test kits from 1890—1940, some eye microscopes and other vintage medical pieces. It is interesting to see how medical equipment has changed (or in some cases, not) since the 1890s.

There is now a new cabinet dedicated to antique medical and apothecary items dating from the 1890s and is well worth a look. We are fortunate to have such historic items donated, or on loan, to the Heritage Centre and appreciation is extended to Harry and others who have donated items recently.

Richard attended the Local Government Professionals Mid-West branch meeting in Geraldton on Friday, 18 August 2023. The Shire assisted in organising the event, which included seven guest speakers covering a wide range of topics.

Our contract Environmental Health Officer Maurice Walsh was in Cue during August to conduct the annual swimming pool inspections. If you have a swimming pool that is not currently registered with the Shire of Cue, please contact Maurice at eho@cue.wa.gov.au.

The Murdoch University Vet Program will be returning to Cue for one day around mid-October. Students from the university will be providing free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior veterinarian. Other services available include microchipping and vaccination at the owner's expense. Please note this service is provided by the Shire of Cue and is only for dogs and cats registered with the Shire. Bookings are essential and can be made through the Shire office.

Council adopted the 2023-2024 Annual Budget at the August meeting, including the rate in the dollar for all categories of rateable properties within the Shire. Ratepayers who pay their rates in full before 05 October 2023 will go into the draw to win one of three cash prizes being:

- First Prize \$600.00
- Second Prize \$300.00
- Third Prize \$100.00

The draw will be held at the November Council meeting.

As a reminder, there are still a number of Shire roads waiting for repair works to commence. Road users are asked to take care when travelling, particularly at flood crossings. 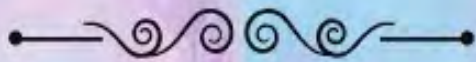

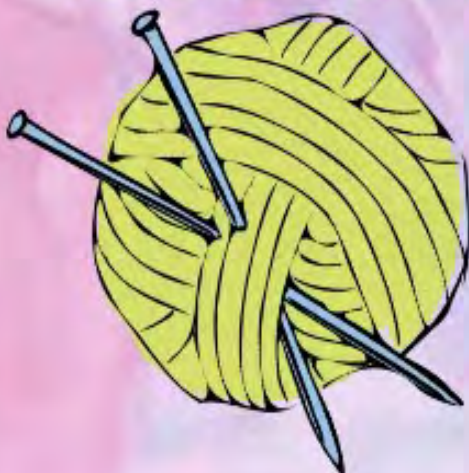

Nominations Close at 4:00pm Thursday, 7 September 2023

Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer:

- at any time during the above period by arrangement; or
- between 2:00pm and 4:00pm Thursday, 7 September 2023 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Cue, 73 Austin Street, CUE.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission (www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 1,000 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$100 (cash, EFT, bank cheque or postal order);
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled *Local Government Candidate Induction*, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating; and
- (optional) in addition to your A4 profile, you may provide additional information that you consider to be relevant to your candidature. This written statement must be not more than 2,000 characters (including spaces), must be in the English language and is for publication on the local government's official website.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

You cannot use Nomination Builder to prepare the additional information.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

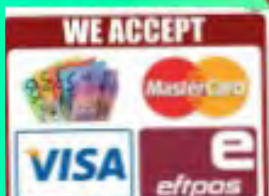

Springtime Stargazing

Spring is the perfect time to get out under dark country skies and be in awe of the sparkling stars and planets overhead. But that's not all, let's throw in a close encounter between Saturn and the Moon, the Spring Equinox AND Scorpio!

The Spring Equinox is on 23rd September and marks the transition from winter in the southern hemisphere. The number of hours of daylight will almost equal darkness!

Spring is a great time to find the constellation Scorpio! It's a large constellation that forms the shape of a scorpion! It is currently visible throughout the evening, lying directly overhead at around 8pm. Look for a reddish star called Antares that lies in the centre of the constellation. See if you can find the curve of Scorpio's body and the sting in its tail stretching across the sky!



Something interesting: Antares is a super-giant red star several hundred times the diameter of our Sun and is about 600 light-years from Earth.

When to look: after 8pm during spring.

Which direction to look: Directly overhead.

For some fun stargazing, the full Moon makes a close approach to brilliant Saturn on 27th September and the pair will look stunning together. For those with telescopes or high-powered binoculars, check out the beautiful ring system of Saturn.

Nominate a community champion for Consumer Protection Awards

- Nominations now open for 2024 Consumer Protection Awards
- Seeking consumer rights educators and advocates, including the media
- Individuals, organisations and groups urged to submit a nomination

The search is on for outstanding individuals, organisations, groups and the media who advocate for and promote consumer rights in WA, with nominations open for the prestigious 20th anniversary Consumer Protection Awards.

Cash prizes of \$2,500, a trophy and a certificate will be awarded in each category, presented by Commerce Minister Sue Ellery on **World Consumer Rights Day** – 15 March 2024.

The awards aim to celebrate community champions in the consumer protection space that have contributed to injury prevention for children by promoting safe product use; provided education on tenancy matters, scams, debt management or contracts; developed promotional and educational programs to raise awareness of consumer rights; improved complaints handling or dispute resolution processes; undertaken research or policy changes to benefit consumers or advocated for disadvantaged or vulnerable consumers.

Nominees will join a distinguished group of people as part of the celebrations including the 2022 winners – a financial counsellor from a non-profit legal centre, a group that created a free online resource to support and educate women at risk of family and domestic violent or financial abuse, a community-based group providing education to create safer communities for children and a regional journalist who reported on fraudulent practices of an Aboriginal funeral insurance business.

There are four award categories:

- **Rona Okely Award** – for an individual who has given their time, energy and experience to influence and inspire consumer protection in their community
- **Richard (Dick) Fletcher Award** – for a local government, non-government organisation or group that has delivered services, initiatives or projects with the aim to build community awareness of consumer protection issues

- **Kidsafe WA Award** – for an individual, local government, non-government organisation, business or group that focuses on raising awareness of product safety and injury prevention for children
- **Ruby Hutchison Media Award** – for a journalist, producer, program or media outlet that raises awareness and boosts understanding of consumer protection issues.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake urges the WA community to take the time to nominate a worthy individual or organisation that is deserving of recognition.

"We want to acknowledge amazing people who make it their mission to spread awareness about consumer rights and issues by offering advice, assistance and education; lobbying for change; creating a greater understanding of consumer law and promoting product safety," Ms Blake said.

"You can also nominate yourself, your business or your group if you are doing some incredible and inspiring work throughout the state to positively impact the community."
